Please note that there will be no power to charge electronics. Any electronics brought to camp will be at the Guides' own risk.

Charging Mobile Phones

It is not necessary for Guides to have a phone at camp. However, to charge a mobile phone at camp you will need to purchase a Jamboree PowerBank which will be available for pre-order from Snowgum.

Cost is \$39.95 and will work on a “swap ‘n go” basis. During camp, on presentation of a flat PowerBank, it will be swapped for a fully charged one. At the end of camp you take home whichever PowerBank you currently have. Please don't write your name on these. These can be swapped as often as you like so a group of girls/leaders might wish to purchase a PowerBank to share.

If you choose to bring your own PowerBank, there will not be facilities to recharge it.
